-  **27** Child care centers can serve up to **3094** children
-  **56** Licensed child care homes can serve up to **503** children
-  **173** License-exempt home caregivers can serve around **440** children

How much are families paying for child care?



MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$107,046

INFANT: Average annual price of licensed care

-  Home-based: **\$11,865**
-  Center-based: **\$15,455**

This is **11% - 14%** of a family's income.

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care

-  Home-based: **\$10,632**
-  Center-based: **\$11,966**

This is **10% - 11%** of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: \$15,677
