## A Snapshot of Children in State Senate District 29

## What child care options are available to families?

-  68 Child care centers can serve up to 5637 children
-  21 Licensed child care homes can serve up to 205 children
-  6 License-exempt home caregivers can serve around 12 children

## How much are families paying for child care?

MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$191,944

**INFANT:** Average annual price of licensed care

 Home-based: \$17,495

 Center-based: \$26,833

This is 9% - 14% of a family's income.

**PRESCHOOLER:** Average annual price of licensed care

 Home-based: \$16,362

 Center-based: \$21,801

This is 9% - 11% of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: \$15,677
